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1 Introduction

The continuous evolution of the regulatory landscape is proving challenging to organisations as they strive to comply with a myriad of laws, regulations, codes, charters and internal policies and procedures across their various business lines.

Organisations and individuals are required to comply with the laws of the land. In South Africa, we are governed by our Constitution, legislation (national, provincial and local), common law as well as case law (precedent). In addition, the King Code of Governance Principles and Report (King III), issued by the Institute of Directors in Southern Africa, whilst not law and a voluntary code, sets the benchmark for good governance in South Africa. King III in Chapter 6 sets out several principles in relation to compliance with laws, rules, codes and standards;-

- “6.1. The board should ensure that the company complies with applicable laws and considers adherence to non-binding rules, codes and standards.
- 6.2. The board and each individual director should have a working understanding of the effect of the applicable laws, rules, codes and standards on the company and its business.
- 6.3. Compliance risk should form an integral part of the company’s risk management process
- 6.4. The board should delegate to management the implementation of an effective compliance framework and processes.”

2 Objective

KPMG Services (Pty) Ltd (“KPMG”) was engaged to assist the University of Kwazulu-Natal (“UKZN”) with the identification and prioritisation of the organisation’s Regulatory Universe i.e. the laws and regulations that are applicable to the organisation.

3 Scope

The scope of the assignment was to assist in identifying and prioritising all Acts and regulations at a national level applicable to UKZN as at February 2016.

Excluded from the scope of the assignment were:

- Lobbying with the Regulators in respect of specific requirements;
- Providing legal interpretation or opinion on any specific legislation; and
- Making any management decisions.

4 Approach

The approach taken to the assignment is reflected below:

4.1 Elimination of non-applicable Acts

To reduce the approximately 850 national Acts that may potentially apply to UKZN to those Acts which have to be more actively managed, the following steps were performed:

- Desktop research was conducted.
- A database summary of approximately 850 national Acts was reviewed for relevance. Two lists of Acts were extracted, namely a list of non-applicable acts and a list of acts potentially applicable to UKZN.
- We performed a review of the internal UKZN Legislative Compliance Framework (V3 – April 2013), provided to us by UKZN management.
- Discrepancies between the identified potentially applicable legislation and the UKZN Legislative Compliance Framework (V3 – April 2013) were noted for discussion.
- The two lists (UKZN Legislative Compliance Framework {V3 – April 2013} and the list of acts potentially applicable to UKZN) as well as discrepancies (from the internal UKZN Legislative Compliance Framework {V3 – April 2013}) were discussed with UKZN participants in a workshop held on 24 February 2016. The list of potentially applicable Acts was updated during the workshop.

4.2 Identification and Prioritisation of the Inherent Risk Regulatory Universe

Having reduced the potentially applicable Acts to UKZN to approximately 151 Acts, these Acts were then prioritised by the organisation during the Regulatory Universe workshop.

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The steps taken in the workshop were as follows:

- The list of potentially applicable Acts was rated for applicability to UKZN by management.
- Prioritisation of Acts was achieved by considering both the applicability of an Act to UKZN and the consequences of non-compliance to an Act.

- The applicability of each Act to UKZN was assessed as high, medium or low applicability. We aligned our compliance risk methodology with UKZN's Risk Framework and used the following definitions of applicability:

- **Extreme / High Applicability (4 to 5)** – ‘An Act should be regarded as having an Extreme/High applicability where that Act is applicable to the entire organisation, alternatively a large number of key departments and/or has a direct impact on the core business of the company. Furthermore, an Act should be considered as extreme/highly Applicable where the occurrence of contact/effect of the Act on processes/business operations is frequent/involves many transactions/ongoing.’
- **Moderate Applicability (3)** – ‘An Act should be regarded as having a moderate applicability where that Act is applicable to a number of departments within an organisation and/or has a direct or secondary impact on the core business. Furthermore, an Act should be considered as having moderate applicability where the occurrence of contact/effect of the Act on processes/business operations is regular in light of the nature of the business.’
- **Low / Insignificant Applicability (1 to 2)** – ‘An Act should be regarded as having a low/Insignificant applicability where that Act is applicable to some departments within an organisation and/or has a topical impact on the core business.’ Furthermore, an Act should be considered as having a low/ insignificant Applicability where the occurrence of contact/effect of the Act on processes/business operations is incidental and irregular/infrequent.’

The output from the workshop was a list of Acts most applicable to UKZN where the consequences of non-compliance could be the most detrimental to the organisation if not managed, i.e. An Inherent Risk Regulatory Universe.

4.3 Prioritisation of the Regulatory Universe

Following on identifying the Inherent Risk Regulatory Universe, workshop participants contributed to prioritising the Regulatory Universe

For the purposes of prioritising the Regulatory Universe we aligned our compliance risk methodology with UKZN's Risk Framework. The following 4 (four) categories were used:

- Priority 1** – These Acts are fundamentally important to the University / business / project goals, and can lead to significant financial and non-financial impact and erosion of value and reputation if not managed. Compliance efforts should be prioritised to these Acts first, where management assurance and compliance monitoring should take place to assess the residual risk. (“Residual Risk” being the risk that remains after all efforts have been made to mitigate or eliminate compliance risks).
- Priority 2** – These Acts have the potential to have significant impact to the University /business / projects. There should be some management assurance and compliance monitoring of these Acts for assessment of residual risk.
- Priority 3** – These Acts have the potential to have a marked impact on the University/ business / projects, but presents less of an immediate priority. Review and update previous controls/actions on a 6 monthly basis.
- Priority 4** - These Acts have comparatively less impact at present, but need to be re-appraised to take into account changing goals and circumstances. No or very limited action required (but continue to monitor regularly).

4.4 Way forward

The identification and prioritisation of the Regulatory Universe are predominantly the views of the Legal and Compliance participants obtained during the Regulatory Universe Workshop.

Following compliance monitoring and any further management assurance the residual compliance risks (i.e. the remaining exposure to compliance risk after verifying controls) should be ascertained and integrated into the Enterprise Risk Management Framework.

In line with UKZN's Strategic Risk Assessment Report, the definitions of Inherent Risk and Priority (used in the table above) are detailed below:

Inherent risk exposure

Category	Category description
Extreme (5)	This risk should be terminated / insured / controlled
High (4)	This risk should be insured / controlled
Moderate (3)	This risk will typically be controlled (treated)
Low (2)	Management will make an informed decision as to whether this risk must be controlled or absorbed by UKZN. The decision will be based on a "cost vs. benefit" approach
Insignificant (1)	Impact and probability is insignificant. This risk may be tolerated, and cost of losses will be absorbed by UKZN.

Priority 1	Immediate action required	These Acts are fundamentally important to the University / business / project goals, and can lead to significant financial and non-financial impact and erosion of value and reputation if not managed. Priority 2	Action required	These Acts have the potential to have significant impact to the University /business / projects. There should be some management assurance and compliance monitoring of these Acts for assessment of residual risk
Priority 3	Monitor	These Acts have the potential to have a marked impact on the University/ business / projects, but presents less of an immediate priority. Review and update previous controls/actions on a 6 monthly basis.
Priority 4	Acceptable	These Acts have comparatively less impact at present, but need to be re-appraised to take into account changing goals and circumstances. No or very limited action required (but continue to monitor regularly).

5.3 Additional Acts for management's consideration

Management requested that KPMG conduct research and provide some input with the regard to the applicability of the following acts to the University:

- Consumer Protection Act No. 68 of 2008; and
- Pharmacy Act No. 53 of 1974

Management will thereafter take a decision on whether to include the aforementioned acts to the University's Regulatory Universe. Accordingly management will then rank these acts in terms of its applicability and prioritization at their discretion.

Our detailed findings in the applicability of the abovementioned acts are attached as **Appendix C** to this report.

5.4 Selected Regulatory Universe Acts for CRMP's

The table below reflects the 5 Acts in descending order of priority as selected by the Director for Governance and Administration, the Compliance Officer and representatives of UKZN Legal Services Division for development of UKZN's Compliance Risk Management Plans.
